- Raised \$420,820 from 87 residents and completed the maintenance dredging of our canals.
- Completed planting of 225 Triple Montgomery Palm Trees fronting empty lots
- Conducted Island-wide clean-up day on March 2, 2019
- Built and Launched new DKPOA Website https://duckkeypoa.squarespace.com
- Held numerous meetings and discussions with the County officials on illegal rentals, county owned lots, unmaintained lots and other services to Duck Key residents
- Landscaped and maintained gardens, lift stations performed throughout the year
- Delivered welcome baskets for new Duck Key neighbors
- Provided input on new bridge plans
- Issued DKPOA ID cards (with discounts) for members

- DKPOA had 244 paid memberships in 2019, an increase of 13% from 2018
 210 home and 34 lot owners

Duck Key Bridge Replacement

BIMINI DRIVE AND HARBOUR DRIVE BRIDGE HISTORY

- Previous Public Meeting (2017)
- Bridges have exceeded their design service life
- Reduced structural capacity
- Replacement will restore full load carrying capacity
- Provide 75 year service life
- Safety improvements from existing conditions





2020 Goals DKPOA

 - Organize a clean-up day March 14, 2020
 - Continue Beautification Landscaping eg...New Plantings, Rock Boarders for Palm trees
 - Work with County to address code violations on unimproved lots
 - Continue to maintain existing welcome and lift station gardens

 - Review 2020 survey results and develop action plan
 - Grow DKPOA Membership by 10+ percent
 - Enhance our new website
 - Investigate breakwater repairs and improvement options
